#### Progression of change in behavior of native reef fish and lionfish over time in the Cayman Islands

- No predators would eat lionfish dead or alive at first
- No internal parasites, or very low at first: Dr Tuttle and her research and differences between the origins of the invasion in the Mediterranean and the Caribbean and how that might affect parasites in lionfish.



Progression of change in behavior of native reef fish and lionfish over time in the Cayman Islands

• Grouper and Mutton Snapper started eating lionfish that were speared and would point them out like a bird dog but not eat them



• Predators made no leap to eat lionfish unaided

Progression of change in behavior of native reef fish and lionfish over time in the Cayman Islands


- Then we started hearing anecdotal evidence of predators sighted eating lionfish and in stomach contents of predators
- Starting in 2010 speared lionfish were being fed to predators or being left on the ocean floor before people realized they tasted good and they could make money selling them.
